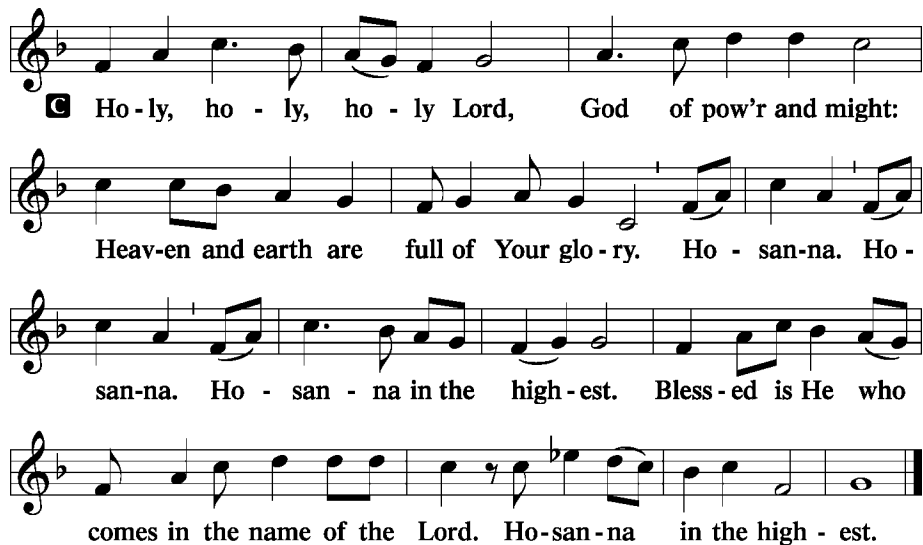


Proper Preface
